Thank you for submitting your Class of 2012 employment data. By doing so, you have made a unique and valuable contribution to our ability to document the employment experiences of recent law school graduates. Because of your efforts, moreover, our collective knowledge of employment status and salaries is better than ever.

Because you participated in the survey this year, NALP is pleased to provide you with your Class of 2012 School Report, consisting of a summary report and 15 tables detailing the employment experience of your 2012 class. Also included is a copy of the National Summary Report for the Class of 2012. The only change to this year's report is the addition of a count of graduates for whom start date is deferred, to conform with ABA categories. You may want to file a copy of this report, since it can be used in many ways, such as working with current and prospective students and providing information to your dean, to other law school administrators, and to outside organizations.

This year's report comes later than in previous years because of the later time frame for reporting to NALP. You will recall that we moved the NALP reporting deadline so that it falls after your deadline for reporting to the ABA. A similar time frame can be expected going forward.

Figures compiled by NALP differ from those reported by the ABA earlier this year for several reasons. The most important of these is that the ABA calculates its percentages based on the entire class, including those for whom employment status is not known. The expansion of the base to include all graduates will by definition lower all the percentages. The ABA figures also include the three ABA-approved schools in Puerto Rico, whereas the NALP survey does not include these schools. Second you are not required to report whether a job is full-time/part-time or short-term/long-term to NALP if that information is not known about the job, whereas both of these pieces of information are required for the ABA. Although not

affecting a large number of jobs, this can affect counts and percentages by a small amount. Third, NALP's research methodology includes an extensive process of quality control and follow-up with schools to ensure, to the extent possible, that job information is internally consistent and in compliance with definitions used by both NALP and the ABA. Finally, NALP allows corrections to data submitted for an extended period after the initial submission. This can result in small revisions and adjustments that are not reflected in the data posted by the ABA.
